Why Ride a Bicycle?

The most satisfactory answer for the sort of person who says he can't think why you ride a bicycle, is to agree with him. If he could think, he would very soon know. For it only requires a very little thought to recognise that a bicycle provides the simplest means of enjoying the personal response to the roving spirit which prompts all of us to roam.

Formerly, the art of foot-slogging was the only one for men to cultivate if relying solely on their own activities. Nor have pedestrians entirely vanished; theirs may yet be a pleasant pastime when they penetrate to places where no road runs, and no cycle-wheel can conveniently roll. But humdrum pedestrianism has given place to the easier, swifter, more exhilarating, more delightful method of travelling, as a mounted pedestrian, on a purely magical machine, which, although it gives its rider no power, endows him with the means of using his own muscles in a way that leaves the walker standing, or lost in wonder why he should stagger footsore and weary on the hard, high road.

It is cycling that has given the pedestrian seven-leagued boots, and also saved his shoes from pinching. It is easier to sit than stand, and cycling is therefore in a winning position from the start.

The fact that you are seated indicates why it is that cycling has so wide a range of appeal to all sorts of people, from the very strongest type of athletic rider to the feeblest novice who can hardly ride at all. For being seated—unless you are so crippled that you must sit still and do nothing—you preserve all your leg-power for propulsion. If not powerful you can travel slowly, and it is possible by the use of a very low gear to use small efforts so gently that a man not able to walk may still be fit to ride. On the other hand, it is possible by the choice of suitable equipment, and, most essentially, by the selection of an appropriate gear, to suit pedalling-speed to the high rates of travel attainable by a very strong man. Similarly the opportunity exists to choose exactly the right vehicle for every intermediate grade of strength and skill, and yet some people declare that 'Cycling is hard work!'

Such a blunder arises from a rider having a machine unsuitably geared for his strength, unsuitably geared for the rising ground he has to climb or to combat the windage of an adverse breeze; or it may be from endeavouring to go faster or stay longer than is proper in his case. Cycling never need be hard work, although the misuse of it may involve toil. Riding a bicycle is exactly adjustable to the needs of any rider. If a racing man wants to experience the fierce delight of a record-breaker's speed, let him take his pleasure that way and rejoice, as a strong man, to run a race. But any cyclist can refrain from working hard if he chooses the right cycle and admits that he is not bent on speed.

Cycling as a pastime must ultimately depend upon the fascination of the game as a source of pleasure, pure and simple.

Proof exists that it is a beneficial exercise. It does your heart good to know that. It is good for the lungs, so you may as well shout its praises aloud. It creates a healthy desire for simple food, and induces dreamless sleep, but fortunately it is also pleasurable, or the millions who cycle today might be seeking other appetisers and other soporifics. Cycling is an ideal exercise, and a magnificent medicine, and these facts help us to take it awheel gladly without our having to regard it as ordered by a Specialist as a cure. It is a jolly thing to do, and it also happens to be a jolly good thing for us to do it. Moreover, there is in bicycle-riding the personal satisfaction of having done something. When you are self-propelled you cannot help enjoying the small element of pride that arises from the reflection, "Alone, I did it!"

Cyclists naturally admit the smallness of their "horse-power," but they can, by taking care of themselves, keep reasonably fit, and by taking heed to their machines keep them running truly, and just as there is nothing to hide in the fact that a man's horse-power will not let him do 120 miles per hour, so also there is nothing to be ashamed of in realising that his purse-power is not enormous. It is the wisest policy to buy the best bicycle, but none of the bicycles, even of the least costly patterns, produced in the Raleigh factory are cut below a proper level. Not even the keenest competition will provoke the inclusion of an inferior model. No sneers about mass-production ever worry the Master of the Mint. And so with their identical reproductions, the Raleigh coinage is sterling stuff; their silver and copper specimens circulate freely, and Lenton forges no base coins.

The cost of a modern bicycle is extremely small, and it is no longer obligatory to follow the ancient practice of saving before you buy, for it is conveniently arranged that you may buy forthwith, and pay gradually afterwards, while in possession of the very thing you want to use.

A bicycle costs very nearly nothing at all to run. First costs, are virtually final costs—tyre-mileages and chain-mileages, when worked out graphically exhibit such infinitesimal quantities that it becomes more intelligible to say the running costs are practically nil, than to try to visualize such microscopic outlay.

Cycling carries the rider from door to door on short trips more expeditiously than any other method of transport. The instant readiness of a bicycle, which leaps from its shed long before any car could be launched from its garage, makes it a winner in a short distance scratch job. A cyclist is often the nimblest item in congested traffic, as well as the quickest for brief errands. Finally, the usefulness of cycling is most apparent where it is the only way to travel from remote and lonely places expeditiously and within one's means, to market, to recreation grounds, or to stations for further faster travel.

But last as first, there is a charm inherent in cycling as a thing in itself, not merely because it is useful, healthy, inexpensive or obligatory. Cycling is just a very nice thing to do.

OUR Guarantee is unique. From the 1st of January, 1907, Raleighs are guaranteed by us against defects of manufacture WITHOUT ANY TIME LIMIT; no matter when such defect shows itself, we replace the defective part gratis. This guarantee is subject to the conditions specified below.

Conditions of Guarantee

With all machines and component parts herein specified we give a special guarantee instead of the guarantee implied by statute or otherwise as to the quality or fitness for the purpose of cycling of goods supplied by us, any such implied guarantee being in all cases excluded. In cases of machines which have been used for "hiring-out" purposes, or in respect of which our trade mark or manufacturing number has been removed, no guarantee of any kind is given or is to be implied.

We guarantee, subject to the conditions mentioned below, that all precautions which are usual and reasonable have been taken by us to secure excellence of materials and workmanship, but damage for which we make ourselves responsible under this guarantee is limited to the free supply of a new part in exchange for the part of the bicycle which may have proved defective, and does not include the cost of fitting.

This guarantee does not include tyres,* rims, chains, saddles, variable gears, coaster hubs, etc., in respect of which we give the guarantee furnished by the makers, usually 12 months. And the purchaser shall not be entitled to claim any damage whatever, save replacement of the defective parts. THIS GUARANTEE DOES NOT APPLY TO DEFECTS CAUSED BY WEAR AND TEAR, MISUSE OR NEGLECT.

If a defective part should be found in any of our machines it must be sent to us carriage paid, accompanied by an intimation from the sender that he desires to have it repaired free of charge under our guarantee, and he must also furnish us at the same time with the number of the machine, the name of the dealer from whom he purchased, and the date of purchase.

Failing compliance with the above, no notice will be taken of anything which may arrive but such articles will lie here at the risk of the sender, and this guarantee and any implied guarantee shall not be enforceable. We guarantee only new machines which are bought either direct from us or from one of our duly authorised dealers, and under no other conditions.

*TYRE GUARANTEE. Dunlop and Fort Dunlop tyres carry a no-limit guarantee. Those failing by reason of bad workmanship or defective material will be replaced or repaired at a charge proportionate to the wear they have given.

Terms of Business

ORDERING, ETC. All communications, orders and remittances should be directed or made payable to The Raleigh Cycle - Co., Ltd. (Bankers, Lloyds Bank Ltd.), and not to individuals.

RAILWAY TRANSIT. Bicycles conveyed by Goods or Passenger Trains are at Owner's Risk, unless otherwise instructed, and any damage or shortage should be noted on Carrier's delivery sheet when signature is given. Such damage or shortage should be confirmed in writing to

Such damage or shortage should be confirmed in writing to the Railway Co., within three days, and reported to us immediately.

Non-delivery of the whole of a consignment, or of any separate package forming part of a consignment, should be advised to us within eight days of despatch.

We do not accept responsibility for any loss or damage during transit unless these regulations are complied with.

REPAIRS AND SUNDRIES. Every Raleigh dealer realises the importance of making adequate provision for the purpose of maintaining in constant service all Raleigh bicycles in his territory. He has available competent mechanics, adequate

facilities for repairs, also a good stock of spares; therefore in all questions of maintenance, Raleigh riders should approach the local Raleigh dealer. We should be advised if any difficulty arises.

ALTERATIONS TO PRICES AND SPECIFICATIONS. The prices and specifications given in this list are subject to alteration at any time without notice, and prices are subject to conditions ruling at time of delivery.

CONDITIONS OF SALE. All goods are sold on the condition that they must not be exhibited at any exhibition in the British Isles without our written consent.

NOTICE. We do not appoint agents for the sale on our behalf of our cycles or other goods, but we assign to cycle dealers areas in which we supply to such dealers exclusively for re-sale in such areas. No such dealer is authorised to transact any business, give any warranty, make any representation or incur any liability on our behalf.
